## PE and Sports Funding

### **Purpose of funding - What is it for?**

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

### **Accountability**

From September 2013, schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

One year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure of additional funding and its impact.

Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

### **Expenditure**

#### **Amber Valley School Sport Partnership**

Our membership with the above partnership involves a local cluster of schools in our area. The affiliation includes entry into the School Sports Partnership competitions such as athletics, football, netball and cricket.

A huge positive impact has been on developing children at our school into 'Mini Leaders', which gives them additional skills and responsibilities in teaching the younger infant children

various sports activities at lunchtimes. We have also been able to provide additional sports clubs at lunchtimes and afterschool.

### **Coaching**

In 2014-15 Horsley School bought into a programme delivered by Opengate Sports Development who are a local coaching company for one and a half days per week. Their programme is delivered by specialist coaches who teach PE, lead development by working alongside teachers, TAs and lunchtime staff; and increase participation by working alongside pupils during lunchtimes and after school. There is also increased opportunity for inter-school competitions. This is designed to leave the school with a legacy and strong foundations for the future.

The programme offers the school planned curriculum modules, delivered by a suitably trained and qualified coach who also carries assessment of the children's progress. It is an inclusive programme, with activity structures designed to engage all pupils, from those not normally inspired by sport to those who are developing higher level skills.

The programme brings PE into each level of the curriculum, from EYFS right through to competitive and community sport. Our aim at Key Stage 1 and 2 is to lay the foundations for a life long participation and opportunity in sport.
